- 'Let's Go' were onsite with a climbing wall, tower & slides as well as human football. It was great to see the students out in the fresh air

- TY interviews and portfolio presentations are currently in progress

- Guest speaker, Aisling Smith, from Pfizer spoke to the group

MINUTES

The minutes from 13th April 2021 were read by Nicola Malone.
The minutes were then proposed by Heidi Robertson and seconded by Helen Mannion.

CÚRSAÍ TÓGÁIL

Tender process is ongoing at present. KOBW Architects have been engaged and the 4 portacabins will be delivered by Castlecabin. These are hoped to be in place by September 2021.

TREASURER UPDATE

BOI Account was closed 7th May 2021. Des thanked Michelle Philpott and Suzanne Moloney for going to the bank at short notice, as signatories, to close the account.
AIB Account is now open and monies were transferred via bankdraft. The current total is EUR4780.07. Internet banking, PayPal and Revolut accounts to follow.

FUNDRAISING

Heidi, Winnie and Des, along with Micheál, stayed online after the last meeting to discuss fundraising and creating a subcommittee.

It was decided to focus on the Auction/Raffle of Breda's Rugby Jersey for now and look at the Virtual Walk in September 2021.

Des looked into various options that are available – there are lots of online auction companies but they are more suited to multiple sales rather than single items. A simple auction via WhatsApp was decided upon which will be advertised through the school website. It was agreed details about the auction may be shared outside of the school to generate interest – via Facebook etc. Restaurants or companies may be interested.

Jerry suggested that we should put a reserve value on the item. Breda will send on photos of the Jersey. Des will tie in with Heidi, Winnie, Breda, Jerry & Elaine to organise same.

CAINTEOIRÍ

Heidi spoke about Lorcán McMullan, Ray Connellan, Conor O'Keeffe (a Glanmire native) and Hugh Mulligan who appeared on the Late Late Show last week. They spoke about mental health issues. She suggested it may be worth having Conor as a guest speaker at the school. Des knows his father and will follow up. Conor mentioned a lot of mental health issues started for him in secondary school. Micheál is very interested in this and will link up with Des to discuss and set it up for the next academic year.

L1 & L2 LEAVING CERT RESTRUCTURE PROPOSAL FROM 2025

Des gave an overview of the Gaeloideachas meeting from 10th May 2021. The NCCA (National Council for Curriculum and Assessment – the body responsible for all curricula) have published, in draft form, Senior cycle teaching and assessment restructure for Irish. This is proposed to come into effect for students sitting the Leaving Certificate in 2025. Schools teaching through the medium of Irish (Schools in Gaeltacht areas and Gael Choláistí) are called L1 and schools teaching through the medium of English are L2. The proposal includes reducing the percentage of marks available for the Oral exam in L1's while not affecting that marking system in L2's. It also involves a higher level of competency and literature study expected from L1 students when compared to the L2 curriculum.

The main difficulties with the process are:

- a) It is not yet clear whether there will be a reward system in place for the L1 level
- b) Whether this is compulsory or if L1 students will have the option to sit the L2 paper
- c) distribution of marks is not yet clear
- d) there appears to be an inequality when compared to other subjects.

Gaeloideachas are asking parents to engage with the process. They are asking us to contact the NCCA and the Department. There is a survey to complete but, in some cases, this has taken over 2.5hrs. The alternative is a submission to the NCCA airing concerns and asking for clarification. The deadline for sending this submission is Aug 31st 2021. They are also asking us to contact themselves, Gaeloideachas, so they may compile a list of concerns.

Coláiste an Phiarsaigh has already had a team working on this and has submitted its concerns to the NCCA via a submission. The main concern is if you have two students studying each curriculum, the L2 student gains more for their oral exam than the L1 student. You could have a scenario where the L2 student could earn a H1 in a less difficult paper while an L1 student could earn a H2 in what is a much more difficult paper. There may be no extra reward for the extra work required. The student is almost penalised for going to a Gael Choláiste.

Mary highlighted the fact this is already in place for Junior Cycle where you have a T1 and T2 differentiation. This is, however, yet to be evaluated as it was introduced for Junior Cycle 2020 which did not take place, as neither will Junior Cycle 2021. We cannot move on to Senior Cycle changes unless and until Junior Cycle has properly been assessed. Mary's other concern is, as an Irish teacher, there needs to be a Junior Cycle Oral exam. There is too much literature on the JC – there is more than a school subject at risk – we need to reinforce the spoken language.

Josephine mentioned a copy of Gaeloideachas seminar is now available on YouTube (<https://youtu.be/d8UChbsj8S0>). This link will be sent to the Cumann WhatsApp group by Nicola. Josephine also highlighted the fact that the reading lists, topics, sample papers etc are not available.

Nicola mentioned the JC 2020 Irish changes were decided the November 2019, leaving little time for Teachers and Students to prepare, again with no sample papers available.

Patricia agreed with all of the points above and added it could almost be perceived as a punishment for students attending Gael Choláistí.

Mary asked if we could perhaps lobby some politicians in relation to this, suggesting Micheál Martin and Pádraig O'Sullivan could be our first ports of call.

Jerry wondered if the drive behind this was curriculum design or points for the Leaving Cert. Should our response be focused on the redesigning the curriculum or targeting a reward for the additional work required? Points should reflect the work involved therefore rewarding the student will need to come into play. Reducing the percentage marks available for the oral exam is a backward step and marks an imbalance.

Julie asked that parents email Nicola (malone_nicola@hotmail.com) with their individual statements and we will correlate them. Micheál would welcome a strong statement from the parental committee which we can then pass on to both Gaeloideachas and the NCCA.

ACTIONS LIST UPDATE

- AIB Accounts for current 2nd Years
Micheál has spoken to Martin O'Connor (Manager of AIB). He suggested that any student with queries should speak to the student officer in AIB. There shouldn't be any problems withdrawing money, closing or keeping their accounts open. If the student officer is unavailable, they can ask to speak to Martin O'Connor directly.
- The fundraising sub-committee has decided to put the Virtual Walk on hold until September and focus on the Rugby Jersey auction

Liam is a local with wonderful experience. He left a great experience with Coláiste following his previous presentation.
