SECRETARY'S REPORT:

Helen Mannion read the Minutes of the AGM from 12th September 2019.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Suzanne Moloney presented the financials from 2019/20.

There is presently €363.67 in the current account and €3720 with the school in Voluntary Contributions.

It was a disappointing year from a fundraising point of view. The Golf Classic did not go ahead on 1st May 2020 due to Covid-19.

The Closing Balance in October 2019 was €4552.04.

Bag packing in Supervalu took place on 18th & 19th October 2019 and raised €1200. This was down on previous years as it was a particularly quiet weekend in Supervalu. The inaugural Snowball Run was held on 20th December 2019. Main sponsors were LP Walsh (€800) and Hovione (€100). It raised a total of €3800, the majority of which was used to fund students participating in The BT Young Scientist of the Year 2020. It was also used for other items around the school. €579 was spent on sitting/standing desks. There were several outlays for this Snowball Run including Inflatable Christmas decorations, Santa Sacks, Raffle tickets, balloons etc. There is currently a €1000 deposit with Fota Island Golf Club. €2500 was given to the school over the summer of 2020 to fund the new school app. The Voluntary Contributions received is to be used by the school as required.

CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Michelle Philpott welcomed everybody to the meeting and explained this was the second ever zoom meeting for Cumann na dTuismitheoirí. Michelle mentioned we were just up and running in 2020, preparing for fund raising in the year ahead, when Covid hit and everything came to a halt. The members of the committee, Helen, Suzanne and Heidi were all thanked by Michelle for their hard work. Micheál Ó Tuama was also thanked for all his help and support over the last year. Michelle thanked regular attendees of the meetings as well as Julie Dennehy-O'Callaghan for her help as Vice Chairperson during the year. Michelle says of her 4 years in office as Chairperson she has enjoyed every minute and thanks everyone for their support during that time. Michelle then presented her report from 2019/2020 which was all-in-all very successful considering there were only five months in which to work.
